## **Round Norfolk Relay Special**

Team GCR were in Norfolk last weekend for their 14<sup>th</sup> appearance in the Round Norfolk Relay. With 17 runners covering stages of various distances, the route covers nearly 200 miles around the perimeter of that vast county, starting and finishing at the sports centre in Kings Lynn, taking in the splendid landscape of the coastal path and continuing through the night on rural lanes and quiet A-roads; with runners illuminated by the headlights of their clubmates in the escort vehicle.

Based on their estimated pace, GCR had a target of 24 hours, 45 minutes. They were playing catch-up from early on at Hunstanton – thanks to the change to the stage 1 route which added half a mile to lead-off man **PAUL GUY's** run, but which they didn't tell us about beforehand!

Gradually, successive legs clawed back the 'lost' seconds, and by the time **ROB CASSERLEY** came in to the end of stage 10 at Earsham before midnight, the team were inside target. When anchorman **JOHN DAVIS THE SHORTER** brought the baton home on the track at 09:32am Sunday, they were a comfortable 12 minutes up on it.

The total team time of 24:32:50 was the 14<sup>th</sup> fastest of the 60 teams. Fastest overall were the mighty City of Norwich AC A-team in 20:43:32, with the slowest teams taking 28 or 29 hours. GCR were the third quickest

team from outside East Anglia, and retained their bronze medal place as the third team affiliated to ARC – the Association of Running Clubs co-founded in the Noughties by former GCR Chairman Dick Meredith to give clubs like ours more independence from UK athletics' governing body.


