HUME & HENSON HUGE AT HUGHES Vets win prizes at Fred Hughes and McKenzie & Hayden scoop silver at Essendon

The winter sun shone on GCRs limbering up for this popular ten-mile race run on country lanes to the west of St Albans. This year's race was run on its traditional course which involves a two-loop route and a number of challenging hills. GCRs were not daunted, though, and an excellent performance by club runners yielded both individual and team prizes. Sixth overall and first MV40 was GCR's NEIL HUME in a time of 57:49. Next was JAMES HUISH, nineteenth overall in 59:34. PAUL GUY finished seventh in his age group M40 in 1:00:13; JACK TANN ran in 1:02:43;

Captain SEAN BOWEN was seventh in his age group M50 in 1:05:41; CHRIS JONES was next in 1:06:45, then ROB HUGHES in 1:09:03. VERONICA SHADBOLT was first GCR lady in a storming 1:14:28 and was also second W55. NIGEL CAVILL ran a smashing 1:14:44; Chair BRAD SMITH a doughty 1:15:47; CHRIS HARBRON finished in 1:16:47; REBECCA BARDEN clocked 1:17:49;



HANNAH FRANK scored a ten-mile pb of over nine minutes in a time of 1:19:50; RACHEL HICKEY finished in 1:25:51; ANDY SHADBOLT in 1:27:56; ANNE HENSON (left, with her age group winner's trophy) shot across the timing mat to finish in 1:28:44 and was first in her age group W65; CAROL REID was next in 1:30;54; NICK ATKINSON ran in 1:32:37; SHENA LANCASTER in 1:37:19; SARAH HALLIDAY in 1:40:11; LOUISE BEALE in 1:41:08; WAYNE AYLOTT in 1:41:53; RICHARD DARLEY in 1:43:03; ALEX YATES in 1:43:05; EMMA DEMPSTER in 1:50:48; CHARLOTTE JONES in 1:52:30, and JANE MOLLOY in 2:04:20.

In the Herts County Vets' Champs, the GCR men's team of NEIL HUME, PAUL GUY, SEAN BOWEN and CHRIS JONES won the silver men's team prize. NEIL also won the MV40

individual prize.

Essendon 5K and 10K

Another contingent of GCRs travelled south to Essendon to tackle the scenic 5K or 10K course around the grounds of the Essendon Country Club, both races being run to raise money for Isabel Hospice. It was an early and chilly start for runners, the 10K event (reportedly a little more than 10K) starting at 8.30am with the thermometer showing -3 degrees. In the 5K distance, SARAH CATCHPOLE finished in 34:12 and TRACEY STEWART in 43:53. In the 10K event, GCR scored a double silver and a bronze, with PETER MCKENZIE second male in a time



of 39:13, and BECCA HAYDEN (*left, with mum Ann*) second lady in a time of 43:43. PETER JASKO came in next in 44:36 and ELEANOR NEWTON was third lady in a time of 45:22. MICHAEL PAINE ran in a brisk 48:24, despite a bothersome knee, and HELEN STAFFORD finished in 53:35. ANN HAYDEN ran in 55:33, a new 10K pb; JACKY O'LEARY finished in

55:56; TOM ROGERS in 56:02; THOMAS PARMLEY in 56:47; MAGGIE WRIGHT in 58:39; RACHAEL EVERARD in 59:53; GILL SOL in 01:13:07, and LINDA HAMM and LOUISE O'DONNELL crossed the line together in 01:13:08.

Braintree Boggle Marathon

Several of GCR's most dedicated distance runners were in action at the Braintree Boggle Marathon, a self-navigation trail race through the Essex countryside. NICK GENEVER reports: "At the start it was -4c and the ground was frozen, but it warmed up later in the sunshine and the muddy fields defrosted." Nick finished in 4:35:01. Also completing the race were KATH EVANS and ELAINE GILES.

In between coughing fits, I enjoyed splendid views over the Surrey Hills, including part of the North Downs. The weather was perfect, with no rain or wind at all."
