# Hayden Triumphs At Forrest Run Half GCR Head to Burnham Beeches

#### **Burnham Beeches 10k & Half Marathon**

On Sunday morning, a small but perfectly formed group of Garden City Runners headed round the M25 to tackle the ever-popular Burnham Beeches 10k and Half Marathon. This closed-road race takes participants round two laps (one for 10km) of the Burnham Beeches National Nature Reserve with a plentiful supply of ups and downs along the way. Luckily the high winds of the previous day had subsided, and a cool breeze made for near perfect conditions.

Finishers were presented with a t-shirt and medal and a variety of snacks; never was a Coco Pops breakfast bar been more welcome! The brave could even cool down in the open-air pool attached to the host school.

RYAN KEAN and JEAN COLE both tackled the 10k route finishing in times of 0:39:59 and 1:07:56 respectively.

SEAN BOWEN was first GCR over the line (and  $5^{th}$  in his age category) in a time of 1:29:48, followed by JUSTIN KEAN (1:57:14), JULY KEAN (1:57:57), JACKIE O'LEARY (2:00:09 and  $3^{rd}$  in her age category), ANNE HENSON (2:02:21) and finally RICHARD DARLEY (2:04:39).

#### **Forrest Run Half**

Also on Sunday, SAM MALES and BECCA HAYDEN ran the Forrest Run Half Marathon in Reading. Starting at Wokingham Waterside centre the four-loop route around the nature reserve followed the Thames path to Sonning Lock before heading back.

Becca was first lady across the line in a time of 1:37:45 with Sam sneaking under the two-hour mark at 1:59:00.

Becca describes the event as very well organised with a very friendly atmosphere: a great event for anyone training for marathon distance or further. The medal was amazing, based on Forrest Gump and his suitcase with the box of chocolates!

## "One Run To Find Them" Ultra

With a target to complete as many 3.28-mile circuits as possible before a six-hour cut off, Dave completed 29.5 miles of this hilly laps in 6:23:09. Dave is well on the way to finishing the 12-month Global Marathon Challenge with 9 of 12 races completed.

## **Battersea 5k**

JAMES HUISH travelled to Battersea Park on Monday to run the Sri Chinmoy Hasty Hare 5k. The "blisteringly fast" course attracts top club runners from around London and James crossed the line 41<sup>st</sup> place, in a season's best time of 17:20. All top six spots were under 16 minutes which gives an idea of the strength of the field.

#### PRIDE 10k

Another day, another London park, this time Victoria in Hackney where at Saturday morning's Pride 10k race, RICHARD DARLEY and CLAIR EMMS tackled the ever-popular three lap circuit

which this year was accompanied by a bracing 40 mph crosswind for much of the route. Organised by London Frontrunners, the race raises money for LGBTI-focused charities and is always a fun, colourful and fully inclusive affair with a post-run party to die for! Richard completed the course one second under 55 minutes while Clair finished in 1:24:29.

Newly appointed men's co-captain JAMES HUISH also took a third-place spot at Brockwell, Herne Hill in a time of 17:43. RYAN and JULY KEAN, limbered up for Sunday's Burnham Beeches Half Marathon with a trip to Stevenage and crossed the line in 19:56 and 27:10 respectively. THOMAS WACKETT avoided a co-captain run-off with Mr HUISH by travelling to Gunpowder where he took the second position in a time of 18:32. At Ellenbrooke Fields BRUCE JUDGE was first to the coffee van in a time of 17:32, while DANIEL PUDNER celebrated his 100<sup>th</sup> Parkrun with a time 20:52. Also at Ellenbrooke Fields, both VERONICA SHADBOLT and MICHAEL PAINE achieved a time of 24:05; reports of a fight over who got the #48 & #49 barcodes are without foundation.
