Dave Heal – Another Weekend, Another Marathon

On his journey to joining the 100 Marathon Club, DAVE HEAL ran his 47th marathon at Phoenix's Pop-up 100th Marathon Robbie Cowlin event at Walton on Thames, finishing in 4:58:03. The race took place beside the River Thames, with an 8-lap trail course on an out & back circuit from the Xcel centre towards Walton bridge. Dave also picked up his Global Marathon challenges awards medal, t-shirt & certificate for running 12 ultras in 12 months. He addes "Now onwards to my next GMC award 26 marathons in 52 weeks - only 1 more marathon to finish and I shall be there!!"
